INVITATION TO STOP COAL AND GAS UNDERMINING HUMAN HEALTH

The North West Alliance invites all north west residents, allied health professionals, business leaders and concerned persons to the Gunnedah Town Hall for a basin wide Health Forum, "Don't Undermine our Health".

The forum will be opened by Federal Member Tony Windsor and hear details from Dr Marian Lloyd-Smith and Dr Dick van Steenis relating to the risks to human health posed by gas and coal based on medical evidence. Long term Hunter Valley resident Wendy Bowman will discuss the impacts of open cut coal from a resident's perspective and Jake Coffey from the UNSW will provide an overview of the Health Impact Assessment process.

The speakers will be followed by a Q and A session to get community feedback regarding the scope of the HIA.

"The planning process does not assess health impacts of individual projects, nor does it assess the cumulative health impacts." said Phil Laird spokesman for the Maules Creek Community Council.

"Government is incapable or unwilling so the community must work together to safeguard the health of all people in our region now and in the future."

"We are encouraging everyone to come along to our health forum which will be held on the 4th August at the Gunnedah Town Hall from 2.00pm-4.00pm." said Nicky Chirlian from the North West Alliance

"We will be having a number of interesting speakers and a question and answer about the proposed health impact assessment. This will be followed by an art exhibition opening titled 'Don't Frack Our Landscape: Don't Mine Our Lungs' by Jayney Carter.
